Homeless ID Project Belief Statement

In 2022, Homeless ID Project staff and volunteers welcomed a total of nearly 20,000 people into our office on the Human Services Campus or in one of our many outreach programs across Maricopa and Pima Counties. With the support of the community, our program staff provided a total of 12,143 replacement documents, nearly double our pre-pandemic average.

In addition to the aforementioned piece of paper or plastic card, there are plenty of other barriers facing an individual seeking to end their homelessness, not the least of which is inertia. In physics, inertia is a property of matter by which it continues its existing state of rest or motion, unless that state is changed by an external force. It is much the same in human beings, except that humans have the ability to become their own "external force" and to change their direction and course of action.

The tagline on the Homeless ID Project logo is "Help Starts Here" and we are occasionally asked if it should be "Hope Starts Here." I say that our clients, in an act of sheer bravery born of hope, overcome the powerful, invisible force of inertia. They bring hope. We merely offer help.

Last year, thousands of clients overcame their state of rest by taking the critical first step of gaining necessary replacement identification documents. With your help we will continue the work of removing the document barrier for those seeking an end to their homelessness.

Mary came to the Homeless ID Project for assistance getting a


