Michele, a member of the San Carlos Apache tribe, was recently injured in an accident. Unable to work, she found herself facing homelessness. Once she became unsheltered, her wallet including her ID, was stolen. Without her ID she could not apply for assistance or receive wire transfers from family and friends. Once her replacement state-issued ID is received she will return to work and school, taking advantage of educational programs offered by her tribe.
